KARL LEONARD HOFFMAN

Karl Leonard Hoffman was born at Fullerton, Nebraska on October 29, 1943, and died following a car-truck accident at Fullerton on May 22, 1964.

He was baptized November 21, 1943, and confirmed in the Lutheran Faith on April 14, 1957. He received his elementary education at the former Red Wing School in Nance county and was graduated from Belgrade high school in 1960. He attended Luther College at Wahoo for two years. For the past two years he was enrolled at Wesleyan University in Lincoln where he was majoring in art and was studying business administration. He had made plans for summer enrollment at the school and to make a career in the field of art. He was a good student, and was dependable and willing to be of service where he was needed. Except for his days away at college he spent his entire life in the Timber Creek community.

He was faithful to the Lord, and made every effort to attend church services and commune regularly. He was a genuine witness to the Christian faith by living a life of peace and harmony with those whom he knew and worked.

Surviving are his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Karl Hoffman; and a sister, Mrs. Galen Malander, of Belgrade. Many other relatives and friends mourn his passing.
